# STATUS OF CHANGE OF PASSPORTS AND INTRODUCTION OF INTERNATIONAL EAST AFRICAN PASSPORTS

### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 During the 17th Ordinary Summit of the East African Community Heads of State held in March 2016, Their Excellences launched the new EAC e-Passport and directed that commencement of the issuance of the New International EAC e-Passport should take effect by 1st January 2017 and thereafter implement a phase out program for the then current East African and National Machine Readable Passports.
- 1.2 Government introduced and launched the International East African e-Passport to replace and eventually phase out the East Africa and National Machine-readable Passports on 7<sup>th</sup> December 2018.
- 1.3 Colleagues, this Paper is to update you on the progress the Ministry of Internal Affairs has made in the implementation of the e-Passport Project, with our partners Uganda

Security Printing Company (USPC) Ltd, a company where Government of Uganda holds 51% majority shareholding.

### 2.0 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 In January 2012, the Immigration experts of the EAC Partner States came up with technical specifications and Passport designs after taking into account the standard requirements recommended by the International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO). The designs were considered by the Council and in the 15th Ordinary Summit of EAC Heads of State held on 30th November 2013 in Kampala, Uganda, considered, adopted and directed that a new generation of East African e-Passports be launched by November 2015.
- 2.2 Colleagues, key among the specified standard requirements of the e-Passport as agreed to by the Partner States is the requirement for a Polycarbonate bio-date page. All implementing partner states introduced fully compliant passports save for the Republic of Uganda that introduced its e-Passport with a paper based bio data page, now in use and facilitating travel.
- 2.3 You will recall that the Ministry of Internal Affairs in November 2018 informed Parliament about the introduction of the East African e-Passport for Uganda. The country's objective to revive and revamp UPPC through a Joint Venture Agreement with the Consortium of Veridos and Giesecke & Devrient GmbH represented by Veridos GmbH led to the birth of the USPC Ltd, whose obligations with the Ministry of Internal Affairs- (Directorate of Citizenship and Immigration Control) included the provision

of a Turn-key solution for e-Passport Project with the following deliverables:

- i. an e-Passport System/Infrastructure;
- ii. supply of blank e-Passport booklets;
- iii. a fully furnished Personalization Centre, to be constructed at the Ministry of Internal Affairs Headquarters; and
- iv. A fit for purpose rehabilitation and equipping of three (3) Regional Centres (Mbarara, Mbale and Gulu) and Seven (7) Missions abroad (Washington, London, Pretoria, Beijing, Copenhagen, Abu Dhabi and Ottawa).
- 2.4 Colleagues, the JVA and DCIC supply contract for the e-Passport System with USPC Ltd anticipated that the first batch of 600,000 (six hundred thousand) blank paper based bio data page passports would be initially imported by USPC and after two (2) years, the polycarbonate e-Passports would be printed at the Security Printing Factory in Entebbe.
- 2.5 However, the two years elapsed in 2020. The Government of Uganda has been under pressure from the EAC Secretariat over the quality and failure of our paper biodata page e-Passport to meet the agreed and recommended passport standard requirements.

2.6 Colleagues, the Ministry of Internal Affairs through a multisectoral led committee led by the Rt. Hon. Prime Minister,

a decision was taken to import the Polycarbonate passports as opposed to the initial plan of manufacturing them in Entebbe given that the Security Printing Factory is not yet in place.

2.7 It is in view of these considerations that have led us to upgrade to the new EAC Passport from a paper based bio data page to a polycarbonate bio data page.

# 3.0 UPGRADING OF THE PAPER BASED BIO-DATA PAGE e-PASSPORT TO POLYCARBONATE BIO-DATA PAGE e-PASSPORT.

- 3.1 On the 30<sup>th</sup> of March 2023, the Ministry started the issuance of polycarbonate passports to holders of ordinary passports to date a total of 104,000 polycarbonate passports have been issued out.
- 3.2 Colleagues, the Diplomatic and Service passports will be upgraded using the same infrastructure after the current stocks have been exhausted.
- 3.3 **ICAO Notice;** It is a requirement that whenever a country makes a material change to its travel document, all ICAO Member states are required to inform all participating countries of such change to avoid inconveniences to its people and for overall safety of the travelling population. This was done.

3.4 The Ministry of Internal Affairs has ensured a seamless transition from paper-based e-passports to polycarbonate e-passports to prevent inconvenience to the passport holders. The two passports are used alongside each other

VISION: A peaceful, Safe & Stable Uganda MISSION Ensure & Maintain Internal Security Peace & Stability until the paper-based passports have been phased out by either expiry date or leaflets are full to warrant a renewal by the holder. There is no requirement to replace the paper based bio data page passports with the polycarbonate ones.

3.5 The cost of the passport remains Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Shillings (Shs.250, 000/=) the same as the paper based e-Passport that is being upgraded.
